The NJ Graduation Proficiency Assessment (NJGPA) will be given to all 11th graders from Monday, March 13th through Thursday, March 16th. Make-ups will take place Friday, March 17th through Friday, March 24th. The NJGPA will test English Language Arts and Mathematics. All 11th graders must take the NJGPA as a graduation requirement. Those students who have Polytech in the morning will be excused on testing days.

- Get involved: Extracurricular activities (both school and non-school) are an important part of high school. Make the effort to get involved with groups, clubs, or teams that interest you. These activities are fun and make you a well-rounded student.
- Complete the "Do What You Are" and "Strengths Explorer" surveys in Naviance.
- Explore your interests and possible careers. Start thinking about various careers you would be interested in learning more about. Explore possibilities and find inspiration in "Road Trip Nation" in Naviance.
- Build your credentials and start a dumping grounds for information in your Google Drive! Keep track of academic and extracurricular awards, community service achievements, and anything else you participate in, so it'll be easier to remember later. It'll come in handy when you want to highlight your accomplishments—such as when you're filling out college applications or creating a resume.



### SOPHOMORES

- Begin learning about the college admissions process. Get familiar with general college entrance requirements (SAT, ACT, the realities of test-optional applications). Your school counselor, Naviance, and college websites are all good sources of information.
- Continue exploring potential careers. Explore your career options in more detail—research possible careers to learn about the tasks, education, and training necessary for each occupation. Work with your counselor to complete career interest assessments in Naviance if needed.
- Take on new roles. Stay involved with your extracurricular activities and work toward leadership positions in the activities you like best. Become involved in community service and other volunteer activities.

- Register for the SAT or ACT.
- Schedule college visits. Spring Break is a great time to visit a couple of schools.
- Develop a preliminary list of colleges that interest you and add them to "Colleges I'm Thinking About" on Naviance. This is not a final list, just colleges to consider.
- Line up a summer activity: job, internship, or summer college program, volunteering, etc.
- Attend NACAC college fairs.
- Junior Student/Parent Questionnaire.
- Keep an eye on your inbox for the Jr Questionnaire (Brag Sheet). The
  questionnaires are to be completed by you AND your parent, and are an
  essential part of writing your letter of recommendation for colleges.
   \*\*\*These are due by May 15th! Please be sure to share your completed
  document with your counselor when all pages are done!\*\*\*



- Preview programs and visit colleges for an overnight if possible.
- Send Intent to Register (SIR), and then withdrawal notification to colleges you are not attending. If seeking a Gap Year, notify the college in writing.
- Check for any other housing or scholarship deadlines.
- Register for AP tests if applicable.

## BLACK HISTORY MONTH





From **February 18th to 25th**, South Hunterdon and FFA chapters from around the country celebrated National FFA Week. It's a time to share what FFA is all about and highlight the impact it has on its members and the community.



South Hunterdon High School students participated in the FFA Careers in Agriculture Assembly. During the assembly, our students heard from industry professionals and business owners in Hunterdon County. Each of the six presenters spoke about what a "day in the life" of their career looks like, how they started in their career, what education and/or training they needed to be successful in their careers, as well as what motivates them to continue their career in the agricultural industry.

South Hunterdon FFA Members traveled to TCNJ to participate in Advocacy and Legislative Leadership Day. The day started with FFA members from around the State engaging in a college and career fair. South students actively spoke with other FFA members, industry professionals and college representatives. Next, members heard from the New Jersey Department of Education, New Jersey Department of Agriculture and many legislators from around the State all of which promoted a similar message of the importance of advocating for agriculture. Additionally, a panel of agriculture professionals spoke to students about the importance of sustainability in agriculture.




## **READ ACROSS AMERICA 2023**
