School Self-Assessment for Determining Grades under the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act (ABR) *July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023*

The New Jersey Commissioner of Education is required to develop a program to grade each public school and school district's efforts to implement the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act (ABR) (N.J.S.A. 18A:17-46)

Self-Assessment is intended to help schools and school districts evaluate efforts in implementing the ABR.

Self-Assessment serves as an opportunity for schools and school districts to reinforce and strengthen HIB prevention and intervention programs, policies and practices.

Grading for the school district will be calculated by averaging the total scores on the self-assessment from all schools in the district. **Our district score is a 72 for 2022-2023.**

A score of 50 indicates a school "meets" all state requirements.

The ABR grade for each school will be determined primarily through a self-assessment of the school's implementation of the ABR using the following:

Self-Assessment Key:

- 0 = Does Not Meet the Requirements
- 1 = Partially Meets the Requirements
- 2 = Meets all Requirements
- 3 = Exceeds all requirements
